

BC Graduation Requirements

- Each student must complete:
 - English Language Arts 10, 11, 12
 - Social Studies 10, and 11
 - Science 10 and a Science 11
 - Mathematics 10 and Mathematics 11
 - Planning 10
 - Physical Education 10
 - A Fine Arts or Applied Skills Course at the grade 10, 11, or 12 level
 - Graduation Transitions (Daily Physical Activity, Healthy Living Plan, Transition Plan, 30 Hours of Work Experience, Exit Interview)
 - Total of 80 credits (16 of these must be at the grade 12 level)

Required Provincial Exam

- ► English Provincial 12 Exam (40% of the mark)
 - If a student does not write or pass the English provincial, credit is not granted for the course.
 - A student can rewrite the provincial again within one year.

Graduation Requirements Vs. Post Secondary Admission Requirements

- High School Graduation Requirements are different from requirements for admission to post secondary institutions
- Requirements vary from school to school and from program to program

Post Secondary Requirements

- Some general guidelines for universities in BC:
 - English 11
 - Academic Math 11 * (Foundations or Pre-Calculus)
 - Social Studies 11
 - Academic Science 11*- (Biology, Chemistry, or Physics)
 - Language 11*- (this requirement varies)
 - English 12 (typically minimal grade of 70% on average)
 - 3 other <u>approved</u> grade 12 courses
 All other graduation requirements apply

Application Process for University

Universities have specific deadlines for applications to be submitted. Early admissions acceptance deadline in April. (next slide)

<u>Current Deadlines for 2018 Fall Admissions:</u>

- Simon Fraser University Feb. 28, 2018
- University of British Columbia & UNBC Jan 15, 2018
- An application is not considered "submitted" until the fee has been paid.

Application Process Continued

- Many university programs now require supplemental applications.
 - More Personal Breadth of Experience (SFU, UBC, UVIC, etc)
- These supplemental applications, should be taken seriously; it will be a factor in the admission process.
 - Process can vary; some universities in BC allow students to self-report and confirm marks in the spring while others will not offer admission until second term marks are official.

Electronic Reporting of Grades Using Your Post-Secondary Institute (PSI) Account

- All students must enable Post-Secondary Institutions to have access to their transcripts for admission.
- Review this step by step **PSI Instruction Powerpoint**. The Ministry has indicated that they will have a more student friendly version of these instructions done soon.
- Follow the Instructions for PSI and complete the <u>PSI online</u> on the Ministry of Education Website. You will need your Personal Education Number that can be found on your report card. Ministry Site: www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca

Colleges are an excellent choice that can lead to direct transfers to University or Specialty Programs.

Colleges Can Provide:

- Smaller class sizes
- Direct Transfers to University Programs
- Cost-effective alternatives to University
- Students can choose to use Apply BC (<u>www.applybc.ca</u>) to begin the application process or they can go directly to the university / college website.





Application Process for Schools in the USA


- Students will be required to use the Common Application for most universities in the US.

- Students will require references and will have an essay component as part of the application process.
