APPLICATIONS ARE NOW OPEN FOR VARIOUS OPERATION: THIS IS YOU! Programs sponsored by The Achieve Anything Foundation. The foundation was formed to develop and implement year round projects and programs of lasting value towards **inspiring female future leaders in STEM**, and STEM-based fields such as Aviation, Aerospace, Marine and Defense.
