PROVINCIAL EXAMS – WALK IN STUDENTS ID REQUIREMENTS

Students who cannot identify themselves satisfactorily will be refused entry to the exam room.

It is the responsibility of the student to provide acceptable photo ID.

Acceptable Identification

Students who are not known to exam administration staff MUST PROVIDE, if possible, one piece of government-issued photo ID from the list below – \emph{GO} cards are not acceptable

BC Driver's License or Learners' License

BC Services Card

Native Status Card

Combination Driver's License and BC Services Card BC Identification (BCID) card (with expiry date)

Passport

Canadian or US Driver's License Permanent Resident Card Secure Certificate of Indian Status

If a student does not have any of the above ID but,

comes from a school that uses MyEd, they must obtain from their home school, the top part only of the MyEd Student Information with Photo report, add their PEN and take it to the exam site.
