StudentTranscripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks, scholarships and transcript, and send transcripts electronically.

Step 1 Go to the Ministry of Education's Transcripts and Certificate website at http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca.

Step 2 Students must register for a BC Government account, a BCeID. Follow the system prompts and register for STS. Finally log-in to Student Transcripts Service using th BCeID.

Step 3 From a student's STS Dashboard make post-secondary institution selections, view transcript, view assessment results, and send transcripts immediately.

Applying to BC public universities and colleges also just got easier! Students can do it all: search, plan and apply on EducationPlannerBC.ca.
