#### Goal 1

To increase student awareness, understanding and practice of healthy living.

	<p>Eight students will be selected to join our labs for a full week (<b>Nov 20-24, 2017</b>). It's mandatory to attend the full week of HSSW, <b>hence if you are selected you will be missing one week of school.</b></p> <p>The highlights of the program are intensive research techniques sessions, including light microscopy, confocal microscopy, histology, and protein and DNA analysis. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience what working in a life science research lab is all about. Careers in life science will be discussed throughout the week. Each HSSW participant will be eligible to apply for the 2018 Peter D. Paré Science Scholarship, which supports an eight week summer internship at HLI.</p> <p><b>The application deadline is Wednesday Nov 8th, 2017.
