PINK SHIRT DAY

The original Pink Shirt Day was organized by David Shepherd and Travis Price of Berwick, Nova Scotia, who in 2007 bought and distributed 50 pink shirts after male Grade 9 student, Charles McNeill, was bullied for wearing a pink shirt during the first day of school. The roots of this "bullying" stem from transphobia, misogyny, trans misogyny, queerphobia, and homophobia within society. Essentially, the bullying suggested that boys should not wear pink, because pink is a colour for girls, and how "gender non-conforming" for a boy to thus wear pink.

BTW-GSA Club recognizes the importance of Pink Shirt Day as a day to recognize the overt and commonplace queerphobic, transphobic, trans misogynistic, homophobic, and misogynistic comments, harassment, oppressive acts, and bullying that affect our workplaces and schools. As such we deem it important to acknowledge this, however wearing a shirt does not stop or hinder "bullying". WE, humans, do!!
