Any grade 12 students interested in being this year's Valedictorian, please pick up an application in the office on Monday March 5th.

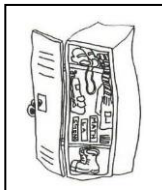


