Oct 5 Ms. Manning	Teen Mentorship Program at Stoney Creek Elementary and Cameron Elementary Exciting opportunity for Grade 10 & 12 students to receive extensive leadership training and act as teen mentors to elementary school aged children. Grade 10 & 12 students will attend a High Five Training Workshop and earn nationally-recognized certification. High Five is a course that teaches how to support the healthy development and well-being of children. Attending a High Five workshop will help develop skills that are integral to working with and supporting younger children. Training will take place at Cameron Elementary School on October 19 th from 10am – 5pm (October 19 th is a Pro-D Day). The mentorship program will happen on Tutorial Days. Instead of coming to Burnaby Mountain to attend Tutorial Groups or Study Sessions, students will go to either Stoney Creek or Cameron. Students will first attend a brief leadership session from 8:45 – 9:00am where they will explore the focus of that day’s mentorship group. They will then meet with a group of elementary school children from 9:00 – 9:30am. Students will then return to Burnaby Mountain for the start of the first block (10:05am). Students will be responsible for travelling to and from their assigned Elementary School on their own (both schools are a 15 – 20 minute walk from Burnaby Mountain). Interested students should pick up an application in the Career Centre (across from the main office).
