# Christmas is only weeks away. Are you shopping for gifts? Don't forget your SPC Card. Over 20 SPC cards have not been picked up.


SPC Cards are in the office for pick up if you have not yet done so. If you wish to buy one, there are 7 available in the office to purchase @ a cost of \$10 each.
