April 23-June 21, 2019


Learn the basics of canoeing and beyond from certified RCABC canoe instructors on beautiful Deer Lake in the heart of Burnaby. This program meets the prescribed learning outcomes for the Physical Education integrated resource packages.

Lessons are designed for students in Grades 5 & up.Up to 10 *participants\$77.25 for each 1.5 hr session + GSTUp to 20 *participants\$154.50 each 1.5 hr session + GSTUp to 30 *participants\$231.75 for each 1.5 hr session + GSTUp to 36 *participants\$278.10 for each 1.5 hr session + GST
