This scholarship was created to support students that are taking a combination of 4 courses in grades 11 & 12 that teach skills that will lead into post secondary and a possible future career. If you are registered in an Asset program you should apply. The elective combo areas that meet the requirements are Physical Activity, Business, Tech Ed, Visual & Performing Arts, Hospitality & Tourism, and Home Economics, Indigenous Language studies. This is a great opportunity for students that plan on going to College and or planning on completing their Red Seal or Apprenticeship. This is not for students that are moving forward in areas such as Humanities, Sciences, and STEM. Students only must be achieving a minimum 2.5 GPA and they can earn money to support their future plans. Please complete the form and hand it into Mrs. Gingras in the Career Center.
