PROVINCIAL EXAMS/NUMERACY ASSESSMENTS JUNE 21ST—26TH

ALL grade 10 students, and grade 11 and 12 students who have not written the numeracy assessment need to check the student lists that are posted on the lower common's windows. Please be sure to note your date, time and location of your assessment. Students need to arrive 20 minutes prior to the start time of the exam/assessment. ALL grade 12 students will also need to check the student lists in the lower commons to be aware of your Communications 12 and/or English 12 provincial exam date, time and location.
