During this month, he led the boys' basketball team through three tournaments while capturing multiple MVPs along with a championship at the Capilano Tournament and a third-place team trophy at the Pinetree tournament. He averaged 16.25ppg at the Pinetree tournament on exceptional shooting splits. At the Rebels classic, Addison averaged 21.33ppg at his second tournament of the season. At the final tournament of the season, Addison averaged an astonishing 23.25ppg leading his team to a championship at the Capilano tournament.
