#### f the student answers "YES" to <u>one</u> of the questions included under 'Key Symptoms of Illness (excluding fever), the student should stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If

the symptom improves, you may return to school when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment.

If you answered "YES" to <u>two or more</u> of the questions included under 'Key Symptoms of Illness' or the student has a fever, seek a health assessment. A health assessment includes calling 8-1-1, or a primary care provider like a physician or nurse practitioner. If a health assessment is required, the student should not return to school until COVID-19 has been excluded and your symptoms have improved.
