

The BMSS dance program cultivates emerging young artists and dancers, but also sets students up with essential skills that will last them a lifetime, no matter what career path they choose.

Program Description

At Burnaby Mountain we offer a dance curriculum that meets the needs of all students and is accessible to dancers of all levels. During the year we will work together to develop technique and skills as performers, choreographers, teachers, leaders and students, and apply these concepts to a variety of dance genres and styles. Students will also be a part of the creation process either in their own class pieces, individually or in groups – depending on the chosen class and level - and become familiar with the process of rehearsal and performance.

Ms. Temple has been teaching for 8 years and has spent the last 3 at Burnaby Mountain. Originally a grad of Burnaby Mountain she is thrilled to be back teaching Drama in the studio that inspired her to pursue theatre in the first place. The one of the exciting things about the Drama program at Burnaby Mountain, is that it offers two after school performance classes, Theatre Production and unlike most schools in Burnaby it has a dedicated Musical Theatre Program. Our Improv teams have been busy competing in the Canadian Improv Games. Last year, the Senior Improv Team has placed in the semi-finals, and would have competed in Nationals if the tournament wasn't cancelled due to COVID-19. Over the years Burnaby Mountain has achieved 3 metals from the National Canadian Improv Games - Bronze 2006, Silver 2011 and Gold 2008. In non-COVID years we have been on international trips to New York City to learn from Broadway artists and to see theatre. Ms. Temple believes that the students at Burnaby Mountain are an "incredibly talented and committed bunch, who contribute positively to the school culture."

Ms. Gestrin has been teaching band and choir at Burnaby Mountain since 2011. She currently teaches beginning band, band 8, band 9/10, concert choir, jazz choir and chamber choir. She is passionate about connecting with students of all ages through a genuine and energetic approach to music education! She has taught for the past twenty-three years in various musical settings, including infant and toddler music classes, K-7 classroom music, musical theatre programs, concert bands, as well as directing adult and children's community choirs. Ms. Gestrin strives to inspire, motivate, and foster within her students a strong sense of self, respect for the talents and contributions of others, and a deep love and appreciation for the gift of music in our lives!

Program Description

Students in music are part of a team! The difference between the various levels of ensemble is primarily the level of difficulty of the music. Students at the Beginner and Junior band and choir levels are given an introduction to the styles and concepts, and they learn the necessary skills for performance. Intermediate and Senior band and choir ensembles focus on higher levels of repertoire, as well as pursuing a more involved concert schedule. Our ensembles routinely participate in school performances, educational festivals, music trips, and work with guest clinicians. Many students choose to enrol in additional music courses so that they can earn their core music credit (Band/Choir 8-12), as well as additional credits in music. Many of our students pursue post-secondary programs in music at both the college and university level.

From there began her love for graphic design and photography, and since then she has been freelancing, learning, and improving her skills while teaching others to do the same!

Program Description Photography

Photography has appeal for students who are interested in applications of the fantastical sciences of chemistry and optics. Photography courses are designed for students who wish to combine 2D design work with Photography. Students will apply classical photography, 2D design and digital photography to create magic, art and fantasy in the world of visual imagery. Students will learn to take pictures with film and digital Cameras. They will also learn to process film and develop pictures in the darkroom. While using Digital cameras they will use Adobe Photoshop CS 4 to enhance their pictures. We

have recently added digital aspect with high quality Canon T5 cameras to our existing 35mm camera collection and Darkroom facility.

Program Description Media Arts

This course is designed for students who would like to explore their creativity through the filming aspect of visual art. In this course students learn how to combine elements and principles of filming to create powerful videos. They develop editing skills through the use of computer software, and story writing skills through script writing. They also explore acting and presentation skills by acting in student videos. Students use professional Cameras, T5i's, light equipment, sound recording equipment, and iMac's, and Final Cut Pro X editing software.

Program Description Graphic Design

Students will use 2D design to create Graphic visuals in this course. The program is hands-on and rich in applied elements. It will prepare students for the evolving requirements of the Graphic Design and Digital Visual Communication Industry in today's knowledge and information-based culture. Students will learn Photoshop skills, combined with drawing and some photography. This course is ideal for students who love to create art and Design.
