
Grade 9's Going into Grade 10



Course Choices for Next Year Must Be Entered by:

Friday March 11, 2022

Course Selection

- All grade 10 students are required to take 8 courses.
- Only students with incomplete timetables or legitimate course errors will be allowed course corrections in September.

Course Selection



- It is very important that you choose your courses with care.
- Schools are staffed and time-tabelled according to the courses chosen by students.
- Only courses with a sufficient number of students registered will run.

Course Corrections

Legitimate Course Correction:

- 1) You are registered in a course that you passed the previous year
- 2) You are registered in a course that you passed in Summer School
- 3) You have less than 8 classes

Not An Error:

- 1) Your friends aren't in your class
- 2) You don't like the time of day the class is being offered
- 3) You prefer another teacher
- 4) You changed your mind

LANGUAGE CHALLENGE EXAMS

- The Challenge exam allows students to obtain credit for a Grade 11 or 12 course who have already acquired the appropriate learning elsewhere. Students must be able to give strong evidence that they will succeed in the challenge. It is intended for students of exceptional ability or for those who have had exceptional opportunities for learning through some special circumstance. Challenge is not a way for students to improve their course marks.

Honours/Enriched/AP

- Selection is done on a competitive basis for certain courses.
 In other words, not all students who choose the course will be enrolled, due to enrollment limitations.
- AP stands for Advanced Placement
- AP courses are university level courses. Exams are administered by the College Board
- Students who successfully complete AP exams may earn credit for college or university level courses while they are still in high school.
- You have to be enrolled in an AP course to write the exam

External Credits



- You may be able to get credit towards graduation for external activities such as:
 - Language Challenge Exams (applications occur in October)
 - Music / Dance
 - Youth Leadership
 - Sports (Provincial Rep Teams, BC Summer Games, National Team Level)
 - Coaching
 - First Aid/Lifesaving
 - ICBC Driver Training
 - Computer Certification
 - Scouts/Guides

 If you think you qualify for any external credits, please see your Counsellor to check this out

SUMMER SCHOOL

- Taking an Advanced Credit course at Summer School does not allow you to have an extra free block next school year.
- In MyEd, under "Counsellor Notes," please tell us your summer school plans.
- Plan your courses for next school year as if you are going to pass your summer school course. If you don't pass, adjustments can be made in August. Keep your counsellor informed.
- There are no guarantees for students accelerating through Summer School. If you choose to take Science 10 over the summer and get 99%, that does not necessarily mean you will get into Life Sciences 11 Enriched in the fall.

On-Line Summer School

Burnaby On-Line usually offers some (not all) courses to fit the Summer School timeframe.

- Registration for BOL Summer Courses will begin toward the end of March. Students in CLE 10 will be enrolled in their courses shortly after registration and can begin work on their course as soon as they wish (although marking of assignments may not occur until closer to July).
- For courses other than CLE 10, students will be enrolled in, and can begin coursework in, the course after June 1, 2020.
