#### Principal’s Report

PAC Principal’s Report

November 7, 2022

#### Updates:

- Completed our first online parent teacher conferences of the year and they seemed to go very well .
- Had our annual Great BC Shakeout earthquake drill with a full evacuation.
- Great Halloween week with lots of great costumes, activities and fundraisers throughout the week.
- Numeracy 12 assessments completed last week with great attendance. Next big sitting is in January with an flex schedule that week. Alternate learning opportunities will be posted on the website the first week of December.
- I reports, if necessary, would have gone home last week.

#### Athletic updates:

On behalf of the athletic department, we would like to thank PAC for their support of the athletics department. Our teams are thriving because of the ongoing support.

#### Volleyball:

- All of our teams were able to have successful seasons, all teams competed in the BNWSAA playoffs. The Senior Boys team looked great in their new uniforms but were unable to advance to the BNWSAA semi-finals. The Junior Boy's had a similar season and were knocked out after the quarter-finals.
- On the girls side the bantam girls finished 3rd in the North division and finished second in our very competitive tournament. Unfortunately, their season was over after the cross over playoffs but there is a strong group to build upon for years to come.
- The Grade 9 girls finished third in their league and have qualified for the Fraser North Zone tournament this week.
- The Junior girls, team competed in the BNWSAA final against North and took the game to a 5th set, which finished 17-15 for North. They are now onto Fraser North Zones which are co-hosted by Mountain and North.
- The Senior team had a similar season. They had a great regular season, which put them into second place going into the BNWSAA playoffs. They made it into the final against STMC but came up short. Regardless, they are the top 4A school going to Fraser North Zones, which will be cohosted by Mountain and Moscrop in the week of Nov 14th.

#### Rugby:

- The grade 8 boys rugby team had a great season and improved tremendously. They made it to the BNWSAA final, which was a tightly contested game until the last 10 mins. They fell to Byrne creek but there is a strong group there to build around for the future.

#### Cross Country:

- The cross country teams continued their dynasty and took home the Junior boys, girls, and senior boys BNWSAA Banners. Additionally, they won the senior boys Fraser North banner. They just returned home from Victoria, where they had great results. The Junior boys team place 8th, the Senior boys team place 18th and the Junior girls team placed 27th on the weekend.

#### Soccer:

- After a dominate regular season the junior boys team played for the BNWSAA banner but came up just short to North. They are currently competing in the Fraser North tournament this week and will play Heritage Woods this evening.
- The Senior boys had an up and down season, just squeaking into the playoffs where they were defeated in their quarter final game.

#### Field Hockey:

- The program saw a huge boost this year and had 26 players. They looked great in their new uniforms as well. They picked up their first victory ever this year and have lots to build on going forward. Unfortunately, they failed to qualify for the Fraser North Tournament.

#### Swimming:

- Lastly the swim team had a bounce back year after not being able to secure pool time last year. We had the second most entries into the Fraser North/ District swim meet. Our boys

team won the BNWSAA banner and the Fraser North AAA boys' banner. We have 7 relay's and 4 individuals that have qualified for provincials, which take place Nov 18th and 19th this year.
