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Scholarship Announcement:

We've got some BIG ones here!!! These awards all have deadlines early in January. Visit the Scholarship Team for more information.


Schulich Leader Scholarships: Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. Every high school in Canada can nominate **one** graduating student each year to apply for the scholarship. For someone who plans to pursue a career in one or more of the following areas: technology, engineering, entrepreneurship and business enterprise, applied scientific research (\$80,000 - \$100, 000)


Beedie Luminaries Scholarship: is for BC students with potential who are facing financial adversity. Students who are smart but constrained by circumstance. Students who are resilient, gritty, and ready to make a positive change in their lives. (\$44, 000)


Cmolik Scholarship: Awards scholarships to BC youth who have faced adversity in their lives and demonstrated tenacity. Each school can nominate **one** candidate. (\$45,000)


BC Excellence Scholarship: available to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Winners demonstrate service and leadership, both at school and in their communities. Winners also show aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. Each school can nominate **one** candidate. (\$5,000)

 **Langara Regional International Entrance Scholarship:** established to financially support international students coming to Langara College in pursuit of higher education. (\$7,500)

 **Energy Rates Scholarship:** To see what the next great minds bring to this ever-transforming industry and want to assist those great minds achieve their goals and dreams. (\$500)

 **BC TEAL Refugee Award:** for a refugee who has shown courage and determination while adapting to a new language and culture in Canada. (\$3,000)

 **David Lam/ TFC ELL Scholarship:** awarded annually to an English language student who wishes to study at a post-secondary institution, has excelled academically and has taken an active part in community and/or school service. (\$4,000)

 **Jeremy Dias Scholarship** seeks to recognize a youth who has taken initiative in addressing discrimination towards 2SLGBTQIA+ folks in their school or community. **(Due December 31)**
