Every high school in Canada can nominate one graduating student each year to apply for the scholarship. For someone who plans to pursue a career in one or more of the following areas: technology, engineering, entrepreneurship and business enterprise, applied scientific research (\$80,000 - \$100, 000)</p> <p>Beedie Luminaries Scholarship: is for BC students with potential who are facing financial adversity. Students who are smart but constrained by circumstance. Students who are resilient, gritty. and ready to make a positive change in their lives. (\$44, 000)</p> <p>Cmolik Scholarship: Awards scholarships to BC youth who have faced adversity in their lives and demonstrated tenacity. Each school can nominate one candidate. (\$45,000)</p> <p>BC Excellence Scholarship: available to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Winners demonstrate service and leadership, both at school and in their communities. Winners also show aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. Each school can nominate one candidate. (\$5,000)</p> <p>Langara Regional International Entrance Scholarship: established to financially support international students coming to Langara College in pursuit of higher education. (\$7,500)</p> <p>Energy Rates Scholarship: To see what the next great minds bring to this ever-transforming industry and want to assist those great minds achieve their goals and dreams. (\$500)</p> <p>BC TEAL Refugee Award: for a refugee who has shown courage and determination while adapting to a new language and culture in Canada. (\$3,000)</p> <p>David Lam/ TFC ELL Scholarship: awarded annually to an English language student who wishes to study at a post-secondary institution, has excelled academically and has taken an active part in community and/or school service. (\$4,000)</p>
