
Grade 9's Going into Grade 10



Grade 10 Course Selection

- All grade 10 students are required to take 8 courses.
- It is important that you choose courses with care.
- Schools are staffed and time-tabled according to the courses chosen by students.
- Only courses with a sufficient number of students registered will run.
- Only students with incomplete timetables or legitimate course errors will be allowed course corrections in September.

Course Corrections

- Legitimate Course Correction:
- 1) You are registered in a course that you passed the previous year
- 2) You are registered in a course that you passed in Summer School
- 3) You have less than 8 classes

Not An Error:

- 1) Your friends aren't in your class
- 2) You don't like the time of day the class is being offered
- 3) You prefer another teacher
- 4) You changed your mind

Graduation Requirements

Students need a minimum of 80 credits (20 courses) in grades 10 to 12

- ► At least 4 credits in Indigenous-focused coursework
- ▶ **7 ELECTIVE COURSES** (4 courses must be at the Grade 12 level)
- ► CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS + Capstone (CLC 11 & 12)
- ► NUMERACY ASSESSMENT (Written in Grade 10) & LITERARY ASSESSMENTS (Written in Grade 10 and 12)

Option 2: Literary Studies 10 and one of:


Composition 10 or New Media 10 or Creative Writing 10

Option 3: English 10 Enriched: Literary Studies 10 Enriched **and** Composition 10 Enriched

Option 4: Language Adapted (LA) Literary Studies 10 and LA Composition 10 (ELL – Consolidating)

Option 5: Story & Stitch 10: EFP Writing 10 & Textiles 10 (must take both, runs full year)

MATH 10



You will choose one of the following Math courses:

- > Foundations of Math and Pre-Calc 10 OR
- > Foundations of Math and Pre-Calc 10 Enriched OR
- Workplace Math 10

Your Math teacher will let you know which course they think is best for you!

Note: if you take Workplace Math 10, then you must take Workplace Math 11 the following year.

How to Choose A Language Class

French 8

Mandatory for most Grade 8's. You'll enjoy learning something new.

OR

Languages 10
Builds on Languages 9.
You'll need it to get into a
Language 11.

Languages 11
Builds on Languages 10
and/or INTRO Languages
11.

Languages 12

This class is advanced and builds on Languages 11. You must have completed Languages 11. It will mainly be taught in the target language!

Languages 9

You can choose 1 OR more languages – French, Spanish, Japanese, Mandarin This is an introductory course, except French 9 (which builds on the skills from French 8).

Intro Languages 11

This is an introductory course, BUT it is **intense** as it combines Languages 8 (if French), 9, & 10.

Languages 12 Enriched/AP

This is for grades 10-12 students who are ex immersion, speak the language at home, or were exemplary Languages 11 students. Check in with the appropriate language teacher if you are not sure!

LANGUAGE CHALLENGE EXAMS

- The Challenge exam allows students to obtain credit for a Grade 11 or 12 course who have already acquired the appropriate learning elsewhere. Challenge is not a way for students to improve their course marks.

Enriched/AP

- Selection is done on a competitive basis for certain courses.
 In other words, not all students who choose the course will be enrolled, due to enrollment limitations.
- AP stands for Advanced Placement
- AP courses are university level courses. Exams are administered by the College Board
- Students who successfully complete AP exams may earn credit for college or university level courses while they are still in high school.

ACCELERATION & REPEATING COURSES

- Due to the growing size of our student population, and how full classes are, acceleration and repetition of courses cannot be guaranteed in the same school year
- Ex: A student who takes Math 9 in semester one will likely be unable to take Math 10 in semester two
- Ex: A student who is unable to pass/would like to improve their mark in English 10 in semester one will not be guaranteed a spot to retake English 10 in semester two (will likely have to wait for Summer School or retake it the following school year)
- You are always welcome to discuss this with your counsellor, to see if there is room

SUMMER SCHOOL

- Taking an Advanced Credit course at Summer School does not allow you to have an extra free block next school year.
- Plan your courses for next school year as if you are going to pass your summer school course. If you don't pass, adjustments can be made in August. Keep your counsellor informed.
- There are no guarantees for students accelerating through Summer School. If you choose to take Science 10 over the summer and get 99%, that does not necessarily mean you will get into Life Sciences 11 – Enriched in the fall.

On-Line Summer School

Burnaby Online usually offers some (not all) courses to fit the Summer School timeframe.

- Registration for BOL Summer Courses will begin toward the end of March. Students in CLE 10 will be enrolled in their courses shortly after registration and can begin work on their course as soon as they wish (although marking of assignments may not occur until closer to July).
- For courses other than CLE 10, students will be enrolled in, and can begin coursework in, the course after June 1, 2024.


