Entering Gr. 12 in the Fall of 2024



Course Selection

- All grade 12 students are required to take 8 courses.
- It is important that you choose your courses with care.
- Schools are staffed and time-tabled according to the courses chosen by you.
- Only students with incomplete timetables or legitimate course errors will be allowed course corrections in September.

Course Corrections

- Legitimate Course Correction:
- 1) You are registered in a course that you passed the previous year
- 2) You are registered in a course that you passed in Summer School
- 3) You have less than 8 classes

Not An Error:

- 1) Your friends aren't in your class
- 2) You don't like the time of day the class is being offered
- 3) You prefer another teacher
- 4) You changed your mind

Graduation Requirements



How to Choose A Language Class

French 8

Mandatory for most Grade 8's. You'll enjoy learning something new.

OR

Languages 10 Builds on Languages 9. You'll need it to get into a Language 11.

Languages 11
Builds on Languages 10
and/or INTRO Languages 11.

Languages 12

This class is advanced and builds on Languages 11. You must have completed Languages 11. It will mainly be taught in the target language!

Languages 9

You can choose 1 OR more languages – French, Spanish,
Japanese, Mandarin
This is an introductory course, except French 9 (which builds on the skills from French 8).

Intro Languages 11

This is an introductory course, BUT it is **intense** as it combines Languages 8 (if French), 9, & 10.

Languages 12 Enriched/AP

This is for grades 10-12 students who are ex immersion, speak the language at home, or were exemplary Languages 11 students. Check in with the appropriate language teacher if you are not sure!

BC University – Second Language Requirements

- ➤ Although not a high school graduation requirement, some B.C.

 Universities require students applying directly from high school to have completed some language courses.
 - > SFU will accept an Introductory Language 11 (eg. Intro Spanish 11)
 - > UBC will ONLY accept a Language 11 or 12 (NOT Introductory 11)
 - ➤ However, some faculties require a Language 12 to Graduate from (ie: Faculty of Arts). If you do not have a Language 12, then you must complete a 1st year language course

LANGUAGE CHALLENGE EXAMS

• The Challenge exam allows students to obtain credit for a Grade 11 or 12 course who have already acquired the appropriate learning elsewhere. Challenge is not a way for students to improve their course marks.





ACCELERATION & REPEATING COURSES

- Due to the growing size of our student population, and how full classes are, acceleration and repetition of courses cannot be guaranteed in the same school year
- Ex: A student who takes Math 9 in semester one will likely be unable to take
 Math 10 in semester two
- Ex: A student who is unable to pass/would like to improve their mark in English 10 in semester one will not be guaranteed a spot to retake English 10 in semester two (will likely have to wait for Summer School or retake it the following school year)
- You are always welcome to discuss this with your counsellor, to see if there is room


SUMMER SCHOOL

- Taking an Advanced Credit course at Summer School does not allow you to have an extra free block next school year.
- In My Ed, under "Counsellor Notes," please tell us your summer school plans.
- Plan your courses for next school year as if you are going to pass your summer school course. If you don't pass, adjustments can be made in August. Keep your counsellor informed.
- There are no guarantees for students accelerating through Summer School. If you choose to take Science 10 over the summer and get 99%, that does not necessarily mean you will get into Life Sciences 11 Enriched in the fall.

On-Line Summer School

- Registration for all summer courses will open toward the end of March or beginning of April. Students in CLE 10 will be enrolled in their courses shortly after registration and can begin work on their course as soon as they wish (although marking of assignments may not occur until closer to July).
- For courses other than CLE 10, students will be enrolled in, and can begin coursework in, the course after June 1, 2024.

Colleges

•Apply to the colleges of your choice as soon as possible. Most start accepting applications in October.

BC University Entrance Requirements

- > Each University & Faculty has *specific* requirements
- > Generally, you will need to take English 12 PLUS 3 to 4 other Academic Grade 12 Courses
- > NOTE: Science & Business Post-Secondary Advice
 - ➤ HIGHLY recommended that you take Calculus 12 or AP Calculus 12
 - > 1st year University Students in these faculties are required to take a Calculus Course in University
 - > ALSO University of Toronto REQUIRES it for Admissions
- > NOTE: Business Post-Secondary Advice
 - Business programs in University are VERY competitive and often look at "well rounded" students, so think about the following courses:
 - ➤ AP Microeconomics, AP Macroeconmics, AP Statistics, Financial Accounting 12, Economics 12, Marketing & Promotions 11, E-Commerce (Marketing) 12

Admissions Updates: SFU & UBC

- ➤ UBC broadly evaluates academic history, by looking at ALL Academic Grade 11 AND Grade 12 Courses
- ➤ UBC will exclude the course with the lowest grade → UNLESS it is a requirement of the faculty to which you are applying
- ➤ UBC will look at individual grades in KEY COURSES → so you MUST have strong grades in these courses (ie: English Studies 12, Pre-Calculus 12)
- > Each Faculty has their own Degree-Specific requirements check UBC website for details



- > SFU requires a minimum of 5 approved Grade 12 courses (including English 12)
 - ➤ Each Faculty has a list of courses ("List A" & "List B") which will list specific courses required for their faculty check SFU website for details
- NOTE: If you are applying to multiple programs, YOU MUST TAKE REQUIRED
 COURSES FOR BOTH PROGRAMS (ie; Faculty of Arts & Faculty of Science)


