5. Old/New Business

BMSS PAC Constitution (Connie Hosie)

This was last reviewed in 2013.

Connie went through the 13 proposed amendments to the PAC Constitution and Bylaws. This was sent out to all parents for comments, one comment was received regarding a grammar error that was amended.

The parents present had the opportunity to discuss each amendment and all the proposed amendments were accepted except resolution 12 that was defeated. It was rewritten from the floor and this new amendment will be circulated to the executive and then sent to all parents. The amendment will be discussed at the next meeting and the approved BMSS PAC Constitution will be send to SD41 and DPAC, it will be kept on file in the BMSS School Office and posted on our website.

6. Committee Reports

DPAC (Trinity Bissett and Ruchika Gupta)

April 12 and 15th - School District and DPAC Meeting (Budget Consultation) -

 \cdot Parent Budget Survey – we received over a thousand responses from parents around

the district. This information was collated and shared with the School Board and Senior Admin. Many, many different ideas were shared. But three themes that rose to the top were: support for and additional teachers and EAs, funds and additional resources towards specific curricular subjects/topics, before and afterschool care and programs. The SD wanted to let us know what might happen because they didn't have enough money for next year, etc., and then they made their decisions after they met with us. We haven't received a written update yet.

April 24 th DPAC MINUTES –are not yet available.

May 3 - 5, 2024 BCCPAC Conference and AGM. The conference was amazing. I attended three presentations:

1. The Minister of Education and Childcare presented an overview of their activities over the last year. She talked about the current system realities, rapid growth and the challenges of building space, the problems that are affecting our students and how they show up, i.e., cost of living, polarized political contexts, climate change, pandemic, opioid epidemic, mental health, screen time on social media. Then she briefly touched on how the Ministry is responding to the context, FSA results, Indigenous students grad rates have dropped again, digital device restrictions update and how schools codes of conduct will need to be updated by July 1 2024 and submitted to the Ministry by August 15 th . They're excited about Feeding Futures for Parents because they want to help the 23% of BC children who live in food insecure households. Bill 22 has gone through it's 3 rd reading, it is on the Safe Access to Schools Act. This will ensure protection of students, staff and families from harmful protests on school grounds or within 20 metres... Mental Health and substance abuse...#1 killer of 0-18 year olds has been from drug related deaths in BC *but it's trending downward. One response.. Erase = expect respect and a safe education https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/erase Integrated child and youth teams were introduced in 12 districts and 8 more will be added soon.

2. It Can Happen to Anyone (ITCHA) 60-minute prevention-based workshop included a comprehensive overview of youth sexual exploitation in British Columbia, case studies and trends affecting youth, online exploitation, an overview of legal issues surrounding sexual exploitation, and family support.

3. Back to Basics The topics covered were Making space for everyone, Reimagining PACS, Breaking down barriers, Frameworks for collaborative engagement, Tough conversations, Respectful meeting guidelines, Leadership and conflicts.

4. Advocacy Support Volunteer Training The topics discussed were what are the qualities of an effective partnership? How do we support the parent/caregiver? What are our boundaries as supporters?

behaviours. The goal is to make headway based on developmental science. Best practices in the home, classroom, and clinical setting are offered based on insight, research, and experience.

May 1 2024 – Equity Scan Committee – Indigenous Student Success. We prepared for our May 31 st partner group meeting In Vancouver. "What do we need to do to improve Indigenous kids success? How do you ensure that equity for all learners is maintained in our district? What do they need and deserve to thrive?" Essentially better consultation is being embedded into this Bill so that money allocated is spent on Indigenous kids and that we have more say in what is being done with our kids in schools. The guidance pillars are: Learning Environment,

Pedagogical Core, Learning Profiles and Policy and Governance. We will be looking at what is working, what isn't and how to increase success for Indigenous students. This is building on the SD 41 Enhancement Agreement that was last competed in 2019.

Grad Dinner Dance and Dry Grad are on June 26th. A reminder as we head into 'grad season' that classes are in session until June 21st Our Spring Musical: Into The Woods is on now. Tickets are still available! The year -end Dance Showcase is on May 16th The Spring Concert is on May 30th. staff have been having many discussions with students in relation to bathroom behaviour at the school. While most students are using the facilities properly, we have a small number of students who are choosing to hang out, visit and gather to eat (?!) in bathrooms. Aside from being an inappropriate place to gather, this behaviour makes many students feel unsafe or uncomfortable using the bathrooms. This feeling is exacerbated when students have phones out.

AP Exams start on May 6th, 3 exams are scheduled.

Last week the annual Red Dress Walk through the community was held. Red Dress week raises awareness about Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and Two-Spirit People. Waiting for the District Digital Device Guideline will look to implement at BMSS.
