Burnaby Art Gallery - Arts Alive Program *Spring Break

The Burnaby Art Gallery is offering two different work experience opportunities during March Break: Photo Documentation (March 17-21 10am – 4pm) This position exposes students to the process of building a selection based exhibition. A primary task for the students will be to photograph every artwork with accurate colour representation, neat framing, and clear focus for photo documentation. Students must have strong photography skills and be comfortable using a DSLR camera. Records and Labels Management (March 24-28, 10am – 4pm)
