MANifest - A free program for male identifying youth to prevent gender-based violence (GBV)

Through a series of interactive workshops, discussions, and activities, participants will delve into critical topics such as power dynamics, patriarchy, intersectionality, and their relationship to gender-based violence (GBV). Our program is dedicated to preventing GBV, supporting survivors, facilitating healing, and seeking justice through collaborative solutions. MANifest Change is a multi-session series project, consisting of five sessions per series. Each session spans two hours and involves discussion workshops facilitated by counselors, facilitators, and mentors. Participants are encouraged to step outside their comfort zones and engage in the learning process.
