Preparation for Nursing Education at BCIT * SUMMER

The BCIT Preparation for Nursing Education Course is designed for students who have completed Grade 11 and are interested in pursuing a nursing career or other health-related programs. This course introduces the essential knowledge and academic skills required for success in future nursing studies.
